Subject overview

This subject involves in-class case-based discussions and clinical placements at Endeavour's facilities. Students observe acupuncturists in consultations for the first 2-3 weeks, then as student practitioners for the rest of the clinic block, treating patients with acupuncture and related therapies. Students participate in tutorials to understand clinical reasoning, decision-making, and point prescription formulation. They will use traditional theories, evidence-based knowledge, and client input to inform clinical decisions and reflect on their performance. Practical skills will be consolidated through performing acupuncture, Chinese remedial massage (tui na), and lifestyle therapies on model patients, adhering to clinical procedures and professional standards. Students will also act as clinical assistants, preparing for future placements as senior student practitioners.
