Subject overview

In Naturopathic Clinic Practicum 2, students build on their clinical skills. Students will act as primary practitioners (P1) or mentor new students in a supporting role (P2). Students must demonstrate competence in case-taking, health assessment, communication including ethical and culturally safe considerations, therapeutic planning, dispensing, and case management. They are expected to practice professionally, identify their practice strengths and limitations, collaborate with other professionals, and develop tailored treatment plans and prescriptions that evidence short and long term effective, safe, and client centric needs.

This subject is clinical practicum undertaken in a working clinic, treating clients from the general public. To prepare the students for professional practice, this subject requires the student to maintain 100% attendance across the on-campus timetabled clinic sessions for the full 12 weeks.
