



INTERVIEW

‘THE BEST PLAYERS ARE COMING TO ENGLAND’

We caught up with midfielder Nadine Noordam who, in January, made the decision to play outside the Netherlands for the first time in her career

What is the story behind you supporting Ajax?

My father supported Ajax, so I had no choice, it was not possible to support anyone else. I have supported them since I was young, they are my team.

I remember when I was at my first club, SV Honselersdijk, we were invited to play a football tournament against other kids at Feyenoord, who are Ajax's rivals. I decided to wear an Ajax shirt under my local team's kit; no one was able to see what I had on underneath, but I knew!

How did it feel to represent the club you supported?

When I was a child, there was no women's team at Ajax, so it was not a realistic dream. As I got older, the team formed and I knew that I had to play there one day and made that my goal.

The first time I wore the Ajax shirt as a player I thought, “Wow, I achieved it!” It was the perfect example of how believing in yourself can lead to your dreams coming true. It was amazing, I have no words for the thrill of playing for my childhood club. I have a few of my Ajax shirts in the house, and I still think “Wow!” when I look at them.

Ajax competed in their first UEFA Women's Champions League campaign while you were there. What was it like to make history?

We were the underdogs; our group stage was insane! We played Paris Saint-Germain, Bayern Munich and AS Roma. It was the group of death, and we were there for the first time.

I have so many words but also struggle to describe the experience; it was amazing seeing so many people in the stands at the Johan Cruyff Arena. We worked so hard for years to be competing in such a prestigious competition and then we were there playing against the best teams in Europe. I enjoyed every minute; even when we were losing in the quarter-finals against Chelsea, we knew we were a young squad and could learn from that experience.

It was a campaign that taught us so many valuable lessons and we also achieved so many firsts: the first time we had 36,000 people watching us, the first time wearing the Champions League badge on our shirts. I will never forget that moment in my career.

What is it about the WSL that convinced you to leave the Netherlands for the first time in your career?

The WSL is a really good competition; anyone can be beaten, so every week you need to be at your best. The league is at such a high standard, every team poses a threat. The fitness level in England is really high, so you need to be fit and prepared.

In the Netherlands, we were competing to be champions, but the teams lower in the league are not the same level as those in this league. I have learnt a lot this year and I am still learning.

The best players are coming to England, it is the best league in Europe, so I enjoy playing here.

How does it help having fellow Dutch players at Albion?

Marit (Auee) and Marisa (Olislagers) help me with so many things; they are lovely people. When you go somewhere new, it is always hard to find your place. You are away from family and friends, but to have them around is nice.

When I came in, I struggled with my English, so being able to ask them questions in Dutch really helped at the beginning. It is nice to have them here at Albion.

Albion face the WSL champions Chelsea today. How are the team feeling ahead of the fixture?

It is a big game for us at home. We know that we play well at Broadfield; having the fans in the stands gives us a huge advantage. I like to play against the big teams and Chelsea need to win, so there is perhaps more pressure on them, but we are in good spirits after last weekend's win.

We are always good against top opposition, so the squad are looking forward to it. We are really excited. It is the last game before Christmas and the team will give our all as always for the fans.




Kiko seals first away win

An early goal from Kiko Seike – allied to a resolute defensive performance – brought Albion their first away win of the WSL season against London City Lionesses.

Seike netted her sixth goal of the season in the sixth minute, firing home from close range after Albion won the ball back deep in Lionesses' territory and she was played in by Madison Haley.

Haley could have doubled the lead after she was brought down in the box but her penalty was saved. London City pushed hard for an equaliser, but even when they created chances goalkeeper Chiamaka Nnadozie was in fine form, her best save when she tipped over Nikita Parris's 20-yard strike.

INTERVIEW

‘I CAN’T WAIT TO FACE CHELSEA’

Skipper Maisie Symonds is looking forward to facing her old club and trying to help Albion make it three WSL wins in a row

Albion skipper Maisie Symonds feels last Sunday's gritty win at London City Lionesses can inspire the side to victory against Chelsea this afternoon.

The Seagulls put in a superb defensive display to see out a game that was settled by Kiko Seike's early strike. It wasn't pretty at times, as the players put in a number of last-ditch challenges to halt the hosts, and the Albion skipper is expecting to see a similar desire from the side today.

"We have that solid structure in front of our own goal, where everyone is willing to put their bodies on the line," says the midfielder. "You could see Caitlin (Hayes) throwing her head in front of everything last week – she played really, really well – and we'll go out against Chelsea and bring that side of our game with us."

"Every single game week, we can't take our foot off the gas. Every team can beat you, but you can beat every team too, so we'll prepare against Chelsea the same way we did against the Lionesses. Obviously we're facing a different team, with different threats, but I believe we have everything to go and beat them. We're finding our feet, we're on a good little run, so we'll be giving it everything."

Maisie famously came through the ranks with the Blues but she doesn't put this game on a pedestal above any other during the season.



"As much as I love playing Chelsea, I also love playing in these messy games in the rain which we had last week," she smiled. "In fact, I just love playing – it's what I live to do."

"I can't wait to play Chelsea because of their stature, but I can't wait to play every single opponent we face. We view this as another opportunity to build on our back-to-back league wins, so we'll see what the game brings."

The wet and windy conditions made it difficult for Albion to play their natural game last weekend, with the points heading south thanks to Kiko Seike's solitary strike.

"We didn't have much control in the game, but we've also played really well and lost games this season, so we'll take it," Maisie reflected. "We know there's more to come from us and we have another chance to show how well we're progressing against Chelsea. If we play like we know we can, we can win this game."

A massive win

Maisie Symonds was delighted with Albion's fighting spirit as they picked up all three points at London City Lionesses.

"It wasn't our best performance, but we showed real character to get over the line," said the skipper. "The girls fought until the very end, scrapping for every ball, and I was really proud of the way everybody was willing to put their bodies on the line."

"I always felt, even when they were playing in our half for much of the second half, there was no way they were going to score."

"We didn't have much control – in fact both sides were messy throughout the game – but once we got the early lead and were on top in the opening 20 minutes, we had something to play for and to defend."

"We just had to stick with it and although it felt like we were just defending at times, kicking it up the pitch and just clearing our lines, we were desperate for the win. It was massive for us."

While Albion's backline and goalkeeper earned plenty of plaudits after the game, Symonds also picked out goalscorer Seike for her performance, which was rewarded with the Player of the Match award.

"She's fabulous. She always takes her chances so well and can score from long range, closer, from tight angles, so we're really lucky to have her," she added.

Leading the chase

Chelsea arrive at Broadfield Stadium this afternoon hoping to close the gap on Manchester City at the top of the WSL table

While the Blues had been imperious during the opening weeks of the campaign, winning six of their first seven league fixtures, Sonia Bompastor's side suffered a surprise 1-0 home loss to Everton last Sunday, which came on the back of successive 1-1 draws with Arsenal and Liverpool.

As a result, City have opened up a six-point lead in the race for a championship crown that has been the exclusive property of Chelsea for the past six seasons.

Defeat against the Toftees ended the side's 34-game unbeaten run in the WSL, but the head coach is refusing to press any panic buttons.

"It's a really frustrating result," said Bompastor after the game. "It's tough, but I think if we analyse the performance and look at the statistics, I don't think the players could have done a lot more. Maybe

we could have been more efficient, more clinical.

"We created enough shots, crosses, and we hit the woodwork three times. It's just one of those games where the ball didn't want to go in, and it was tough.

"But if you want to win games you have to make sure you score goals. I think, again, if you look at our statistics, we are creating enough to win the games, but we are just not being efficient at finishing the chances. I think for now what we need to solve is how we can get back to scoring goals."

On their day, Chelsea certainly know where the back of the net is, having beaten Aston Villa 3-1 and West Ham United 4-0 on their travels. In the Champions League, too, Paris FC were beaten 4-0, while Austrian side St. Polten were hit for six.

Another impressive highlight was an opening-day 2-1 league defeat of

title rivals City in front of over 14,000 fans at Stamford Bridge. The game featured defender

Ellie Carpenter, a new signing from Lyon, while goalkeepers Livia Peng (Werder Bremen) and Becky Spencer (Spurs) and forwards Mara Alber (Hoffenheim) and Alyssa Thompson (Angel City) have also joined a club that are focused as much on a Champions League charge as a successful league campaign.

Indeed, despite all their success, the Blues are still to lift Europe's top prize, but they look to be heading in the right direction again this season following Wednesday's victory against Roma, when the team certainly found its shooting boots.

A 6-0 hammering moved Bompastor's side up to third in the table, in a game which saw six different scorers, albeit the opener coming from defender

Valentina Bergamaschi who headed past her own goalkeeper on 13 minutes.

"Sometimes it helps just to turn things around to score early on in the game," said the coach. "It gives enough confidence to the players to score even more goals and to create even more situations.

"The fact that we scored the first goal as an own goal, probably the confidence for the other team goes down, and our confidence goes up. When you are able to go in 3-0 up at half-time, I think it's a big break and big enough for you to be confident.

"I'm really pleased with tonight, and I think keeping the momentum now will be crucial. We know where we are in the league table, we know we have an important game on Sunday, and there are three more games left in different competitions, and we want to win them all."

ONE TO WATCH

Ellie Carpenter

The Australia international was named the W-League's Young Footballer of the Year for two consecutive years during her spells at Western Sydney Wanderers and Canberra United.

Moving to the United States in 2018, she became the youngest player in NWSL history when she made her debut for Portland Thorns that May, having just turned 18.

Having helped her side reach the play-offs, Ellie then returned home, joining Melbourne City on a one-season loan. After winning the league title, she was named the league's Young Footballer of the Year for a third consecutive year.

Her impressive form secured a move to European giants Lyon, the highlight being a starting place in the 3-1 Champions League victory against Barcelona in 2022.

Carpenter moved to Chelsea in July, to be reunited with Sonia Bompastor, and enjoyed an impressive debut in the wing-back role, providing an assist for Aggie Beever-Jones in the opening-day win against Manchester City.

A regular for the Blues this season, she is also a mainstay of the Matildas' side, making her debut aged just 15, against Vietnam in 2016.

Both sides played out a thriller as the shares were spoiled at Broadfield Stadium last season.

An outstanding first-half performance from the Seagulls resulted in Marisa Olislagers grabbing a deserved equaliser in the 22nd minute after Sandy Baltimore's brilliant early volley had put Chelsea in front.

Skipper Vicky Losada then handed the hosts the lead shortly before the break with a close-range finish, only for Lauren James to net the equaliser on the hour mark – tucking home Mayra Ramirez's effort that had been saved by Melina Loek.

TV replays showed James had been standing in an offside position, but, with no VAR, the goal stood.

The game also witnessed the debut of Chelsea's world-record signing Naomi Girma, who was forced off through injury in the opening half with the Blues 2-1 down.

"We were really, really good, especially in the first half," said Albion head coach Dario Vidosic. "We created lots of chances and were probably a little unlucky not to go 3-1 up."

"We put in a lot of effort and intensity and had a good belief in how we play."

Opposite number Sonia Bompastor was less pleased with her side, stating: "We had some troubles in the first half because our intentions were not good enough."

"This league is really competitive and Brighton made a good start to the game. We are Chelsea and, with the quality of the players, we need to do better than we did today."

BRIGHTON BID TO BE WORLD CUP HOST

The club have bid to be a host venue, should the UK be successful in their bid to host the 2035 FIFA Women's World Cup



A shared bid by the associations of England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales was delivered to FIFA to stage the 12th edition of the tournament recently.

Zoe Johnson, Albion's managing director of women's and girls' football, said, "We want Brighton & Hove to continue to be a beacon for the women's game into the next decade and beyond our 2030 Vision.

"With our own commitment and vision to grow the women's game in the city, it would be a wonderful incentive for our young players to know that in ten years they could be playing at a FIFA World Cup here in the UK.

"We're fully behind what we hope will be a successful bid by the UK and would welcome the opportunity to stage matches at our stadium, which has already played host to games for some incredible top-level international tournaments."

Michelle Walder, chair of the club's women's board, added, "We saw first-hand the positive impact staging the Euros had on women's

and girls' football in Brighton & Hove, Sussex and across the whole of England. If the bid is successful, it would be an incredible opportunity to continue that growth of the game throughout the UK and Northern Ireland at what would be a once-in-a-lifetime event.

"We wish the UK every success with the bid and hope we can play our part by staging games here in Brighton."

Chief executive and deputy chairman Paul Barber said, "As the women's game continues to grow globally, the 2035 FIFA World Cup promises to be a spectacular event. The UK has put together a compelling bid to stage the tournament and if successful we would be delighted to host games at the Amex."

Paul Mullen, Albion's chief operating officer, added, "We loved hosting matches at the 2022 Women's Euros and more recently for the Women's Rugby World Cup. It showcased the stadium, our welcoming staff and great facilities,


as well as the city of Brighton & Hove, at its very best.

"If the UK bid is successful, we would be delighted to have the opportunity of making it a hat-trick of staging world-class events showcasing high-performing female athletes here in Brighton & Hove."

The UK has made the only bid to host the tournament, with the decision to be ratified on 30 April 2026. The host venues will be confirmed in 2030.






Albion impress at the Amex


