BE PRESENT

Relax. Trust that the partners and trip leaders will handle things so you can absorb each new experience. Connect with others and listen for God's plans.

YIELD

God's greatest work is the work he wants to do in you. Use this adventure as a chance to listen for His voice then step out on faith.

At the end of the day, it's about being FLEXIBLE and allowing God to work.

AS A TEAM MEMBER, I COMMIT...

These key principles will maximize the impact of your experience, keep everyone safe, and facilitate transformation and growth. Take this seriously; it will benefit you and everyone around you.

___ To do all I can to ensure this trip is a blessing to me, my teammates, the organizations we are working under, our partners, and, most importantly, the people we serve.

___ To be open to receive what this trip has to offer me, and in pursuit of that to consciously and continuously put myself in a position to best experience the people I work with, the people I serve, and the environment in which I will be working.

___ To recognize that while I may have the ability to bless others, the people I am serving and working with have much to offer; I will be a servant-learner.

___ To always and diligently watch out for those around me—my roommate and fellow team members—to ensure that everyone is safe and healthy at all times, and to take action if that is not the case.

___ To avoid actions that will disrupt the team and our ability to accomplish our mission. This includes, but is not limited to: same sex and/or extramarital sex, drug and alcohol abuse, violent actions, etc.

___ To remember that my actions not only reflect on me but also on all other members of the groups with whom I am associated. I will remember that one person's positive or negative viewpoint of any of these groups can be forever altered by my actions.

___ To accept that everyone will engage uniquely on this trip. To recognize that some team members will work harder than others, some team members will spend more time

building relationships than others, and we will all approach different situations in different ways—all of which are critical to the success of our team.

___ To solve problems by going directly to the person with whom I have a concern prior to enlisting support from other people. If, after the initial difficult conversation I still don't feel right, I will ask someone who might feel the same way if they will go with me to resume the difficult conversation. If after that interaction I haven't been satisfied, I will find a person in a position of leadership and seek their guidance.

___ To put the team ahead of myself, understanding that the team's purpose is more important than my personal comfort. To stay flexible and accept change as it comes, regardless of my own feelings and to follow the team plan even if it doesn't fit my specific wants.

___ To trust those in authority over me. Even when a decision is made that I don't understand, I will remember that I don't have all the information nor the responsibility of those in leadership. I will commit to not being a burden to team leaders so they can focus on the purpose of our team and not my personal issues.

___ To do my best to keep a positive attitude, knowing that this trip can be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for me, and to remain open-minded to all that I will see and experience.

RECEIVER

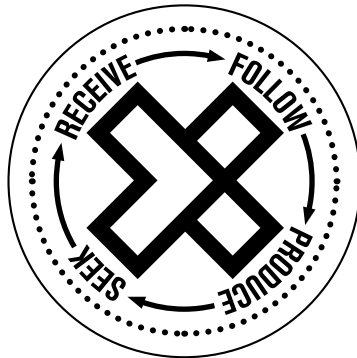
A receiver has decided to accept God's love through Jesus. Accepting means believing God, embracing his message, and having faith in his promises.

CONNECT WITH GOD DAILY



God loves you and wants to spend time with you exactly as you are. He wants you to bring all of yourself: your concerns, your joy, your exhaustion—ALL OF IT.

Spending 15–20 minutes daily with God can bring clarity and transformation. Here are some other great benefits:

→ **INNER PEACE**

Stepping away from the noise can bring calm and balance to your mind and emotions.

→ **GROWTH**

By reflecting on your actions, you can seek growth and forgiveness.

→ **WISDOM**

Quiet time helps you hear God's guidance for life's decisions and challenges.

→ **CONNECTION TO THE HOLY SPIRIT**

Listen for those quiet promptings and then act. See what happens.

This guide is designed to help facilitate Daily Time with God. It might just be the most important thing you do the entire trip.

DAILY TRIP RHYTHMS

Each day during the trip you'll have the opportunity to process what you experience. Your Trip Leader and GO Group Leaders will guide you through specific content on a number of different topics related to your trip. You'll follow this daily rhythm:

Mornings

→ **DAILY CHALLENGE**

Each day your trip leader will assign a Daily Challenge. They'll get you thinking about—and, more importantly, acting on—the day's theme. Complete your challenge before your GO Group meeting at the end of the day when you'll discuss it.

Evenings

→ **RECEIVE TEACHING**

A deeper dive into the day's theme shared by your worship leader and trip leader.

→ **DAILY TIME WITH GOD**

Twenty minutes of solitude time to connect with God. Don't skip this. Use this time to capture thoughts and ideas God may reveal to you. Trust us—you'll be glad you did and you might be bummed if you don't.

→ **GO GROUP DISCUSSION**

A time to process your Daily Challenge, Large Group Teaching, Connect with God time, and your overall trip experience.

God wants to grow you during this trip. This daily rhythm will help you slow down, listen, and process what He may be telling you.

ADDITIONAL REMINDERS:

- Complete all Go Method checklist requirements.
- Make sure your profile photo is uploaded in Go Method.
- Read through your location handbook at the QR code above.
- Start your fundraising early! There are tips at the QR code above.
- Order your passport (passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond return date).
- Check the CDC website (cdc.gov/travel) and talk to your doctor about vaccinations.

CALL TO ACTION - GO GROUP MEETINGS

GO Groups exist to make large trips feel smaller and are a place to process your trip journey. You'll have two GO Group meetings before you depart.

→ GO GROUP LEADERS

Before your trip departure, find time to meet with your GO Group a minimum of two times. You'll need about 90 minutes for each meeting. The content in the GO Group tabbed section will guide your discussion.

→ GO GROUP PARTICIPANTS

Complete the homework section of the GO Group tab before your GO Group meeting. You'll use your answers from the homework to introduce yourself, share your story, and get to know each other.

SHARE YOUR STORY

→ WHY SHARE YOUR STORY?

Inspire and Encourage:

Your story can uplift others and provide hope.

Build Authentic Connections:

Being real allows for genuine relationships.

Normalize Struggles:

Sharing challenges helps others feel safe to open up.

→ HOW TO SHARE YOUR STORY?

Reflect:

Understand how your past has shaped you.

Be Vulnerable:

Share both victories and struggles with honesty.

Respect Boundaries:

Share what feels comfortable, and respect that others also only need to share what feels comfortable to them.

→ PRO TIPS

- » Keep your story under 10 minutes. Somewhere between 5–10 minutes is perfect!
- » Be brave. God and your group are here to listen with care.
- » Use the guided questions from your homework on the previous pages to help focus your sharing.

LISTEN LIKE A PRO

Listening well can make all the difference when someone's opening up.

Here are some pro tips:

Be All In

Give them your full attention. Put your phone away, make eye contact, and show you're there for them.

Feel It Out

Put yourself in their shoes and try to feel what they're going through. This is empathy in action, and it works wonders.

Let Them Talk

Resist the urge to jump in with your two cents. Just let them speak. You'll get your turn.

Nod Like You Mean It

Show you're tuned in with a nod, a smile, or a well-timed "mm-hmm."

Ask the Good Stuff

When it's time to respond, ask open-ended questions that let them go deeper.

Keep It Judgment-Free

Even if you don't quite get it, validate their feelings. A simple "That sounds tough" can go a long way.

Echo What Matters

Reflect back what you've heard to show you're paying attention. "So you're saying...?" helps confirm you're on the same page.

Keep the Vault Locked

What's shared in the circle stays in the circle. Respect their privacy, and don't go spilling any secrets.

Be Cool With Silence

Sometimes people need a minute to gather their thoughts. Be patient, give them the time, and wait for them to open up.

GO GROUP DISCUSSION- COMMUNITY

Remember, your trip journey started the day you signed up! One of the first things you'll want to do is to build community.

In the first pre-trip meeting, we talked about the daily rhythms you'll experience on the trip, and we got in our first rep in order to build this rhythm. We flipped to the On-The-Ground tab of this book, and talked about "Community."

PRE-TRIP MEETING NO. 2

BAPTISM



Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call." —Acts 2:38–39

Baptism is like announcing to everyone, "I am a follower of Jesus." It is an outward demonstration of an inner change that has already occurred through personal faith in Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. It serves as a declaration of your commitment, and it's one of the most important choices you will ever make.

Near the end of the trip there will be an opportunity for baptism. Your GO Group leaders, trip leader, and worship leader are available to discuss this decision with you. Take the time to talk with them about where you are in your spiritual journey and share your thoughts or questions. They are prepared to guide and support you as you consider this significant step in your faith.

Remember, choosing to follow Jesus is not a one-time event but a lifelong journey. It's a decision best supported by a community of believers. So, don't walk this path alone.

Here are a few reflections as you consider getting baptized.

Why do I want to be baptized? What does it mean to me personally?

Reflecting on my spiritual growth, what is baptism's role in that journey?

After baptism, what changes might I need to make in my life? What challenges do I foresee?

Most importantly, am I ready to publicly profess my faith in front of others and commit to living a life aligned with Jesus Christ as my Lord?

CALL TO ACTION - PREP FOR TRIP DEPARTURE

GO GROUP PARTICIPANTS:

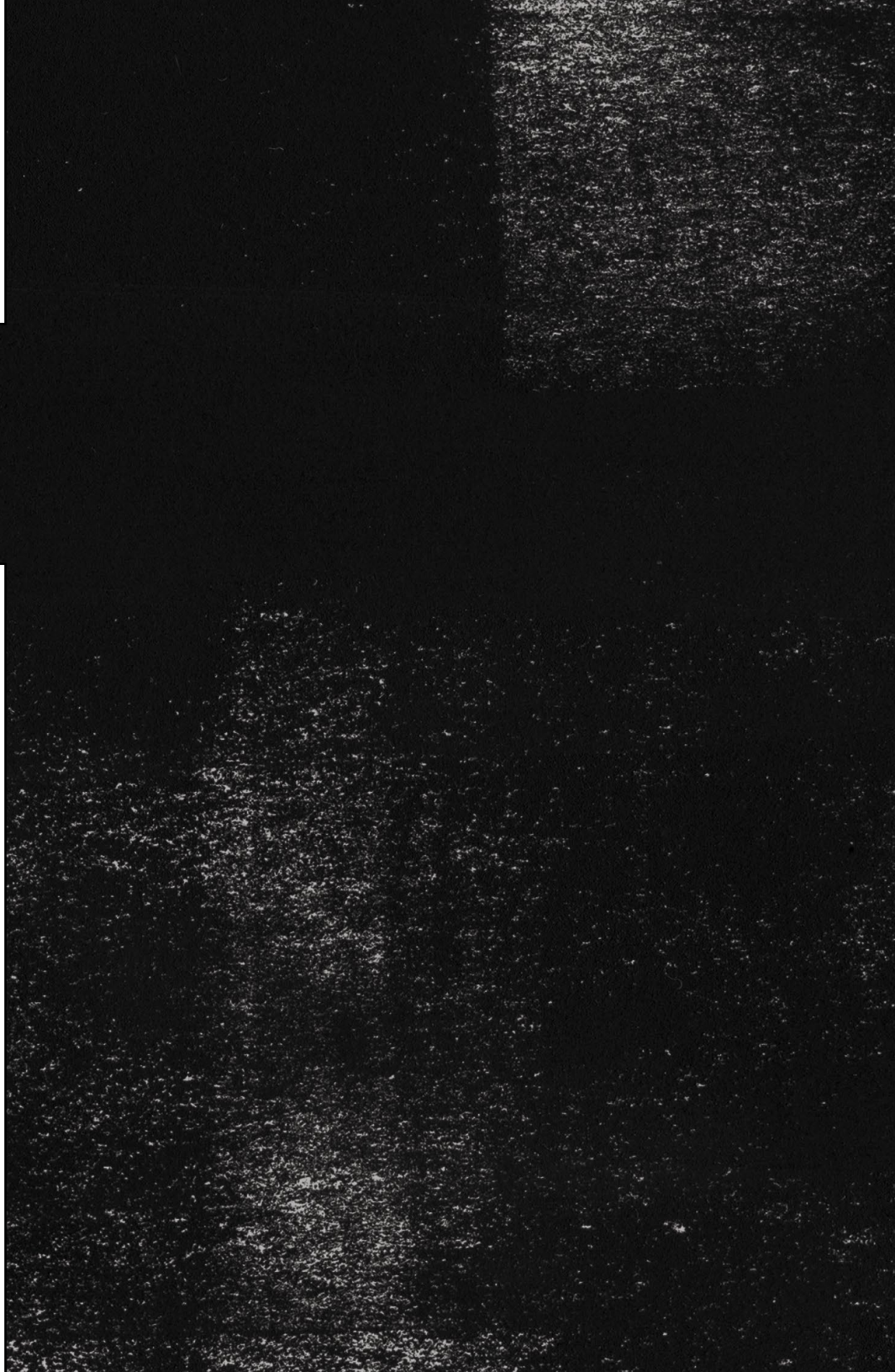
- Double-check your location handbook for the packing list and other location information. **crossroads.net/go/trips/resources**
- Remember to pack this Field Guide. You'll use it throughout the trip.
- Pack light and plan on one carry-on sized bag and one backpack.
 - » One checked bag under 50 lbs. is included in your trip fee.
 - » Most trip partners only have space to transport one carry-on size bag per person, and space can get tight in the rooms with multiple or large bags.
 - » Note: You will have to use a personal credit card to pay airline fees for extra bags or overweight/oversized bags.
- Remember your passport, and keep it on you throughout your flights.**
- Arrange for a ride to the airport.
- Arrive at the airport 3 hours in advance and meet at baggage check.
 - » Each trip is booked as a group block of seats, and the check in process will be different than normal. It's important that we have time to check in together and handle any issues.
 - » We'll all check in together, head through security together, and make our way to the departure gate together.

DAILY RHYTHMS

Our culture loves to celebrate individualism. We're taught to be self-sufficient, solve our problems, and achieve success on our own. But if we're honest, this idea of total self-reliance doesn't hold up. None of us has all the answers or endless strength—we all need help along the way.

The truth is, we weren't made to do life alone. God designed us to rely on each other and share life as part of a greater whole. Paul explains this in 1 Corinthians 12, comparing us to a human body with many parts. Each part is unique and essential, yet completely interconnected. Like the eyes needing the heart to survive, we thrive when we work together and support one another.

Sharing our strengths, burdens, and joys creates space for authentic connection. When we acknowledge our need for others, we open ourselves to the richness of community—a place where we're stronger together than we could ever be on our own.

Throughout this trip, lean into the power of connection. Ask someone for help, offer support, or simply thank those who have walked alongside you. Let's build each other up and remember we're not meant to do life alone. Together, we reflect God's love and design.

When we engage in GO Trips, we're called to reflect God's love and grace to people in communities different from our own. Cultural understanding is essential to do this well. Learning about the beliefs, traditions, and practices of others opens our eyes to the unique ways God works in their lives and broadens our understanding of His love.

Sometimes cultural differences may be difficult for us to understand. It's easy to judge. Remember that everyone was brought up with different norms and beliefs. If you feel yourself beginning to judge, resist and just love like Jesus. Be an example of Christ's grace and love.

Cultural awareness isn't just practical—it's deeply spiritual. When we step into someone else's world and humbly learn about their values and customs, we see God's Spirit moving in ways that challenge and expand our perspective. This journey deepens our faith and reveals the beauty of God's kingdom, which is far bigger than our own experiences.

On GO Trips cultural understanding builds trust and fosters genuine relationships. By approaching others with humility and respect, we show that we're there to learn and serve alongside them—not to impose our own ideas. This creates a foundation for meaningful service and reflects Christ's love in a tangible way.

Jesus modeled this during His ministry, meeting people where they were and honoring their unique stories. Let's follow His example. Take time during this trip to learn about the culture of those you serve, listen with an open heart, and let God show you the beauty of His creation through their lives. As you do, you'll not only grow spiritually but also reflect His love in powerful ways.

God's vision for the Church is unity—a community where every individual belongs and no one stands alone. In Galatians 3:25–28, Paul reminds us that in Christ distinctions like ethnicity, status, or gender dissolve; we are one family under God. This isn't just a comforting thought—it's a charge to action. Unity calls us to invest in each other's lives with care, support, and accountability. It's not about mere coexistence; it's about becoming a family that thrives together.

Living out this calling means showing up for one another in joy and struggle, putting aside differences, and embracing a shared mission of love. The unity we're called to build reflects God's heart for His people and stands as a beacon of hope in a fragmented world. The Church united is the evidence of God's transformative power.

But this kind of unity doesn't happen passively—it requires intentional steps to foster mutual understanding and collaboration. It challenges us to choose relationships over preferences, humility over pride, and service over self-interest. As Psalm 133:1 says, "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" Together, we embody the love of Christ in ways that ripple outward to transform the world around us.

Unity starts with one small step. Take it.

It's easy to grow accustomed to a life of relative ease compared to many parts of the world and moments in history. But comfort doesn't make us immune to challenges. Whether big or small, suffering is a universal experience that none of us escape.

The Bible is clear about this. In 1 Peter 4:12-13, Peter reminds us not to be shocked when difficulties arise, calling them a normal part of life. More than that, he urges us to find joy in the midst of trials, recognizing them as a chance to share in Christ's sufferings. Why? Because when we endure with faith, we can trust that God is working something good in us and through us.

When faced with suffering, we have two choices. Culture tells us to see trials as personal attacks or injustices. This path leads to bitterness and a need for vengeance. But Jesus offers another way—He invites us to face hardships with hope, trusting that God is using even our pain for a redemptive purpose. By following Him we are equipped to offer forgiveness, find healing, and grow stronger, no matter the trial.

Think of something on this trip that has caused you to "suffer" in some way. Then spend time with God, reflecting on what he might be trying to teach you. You're not walking this path alone—God is with you every step, offering strength, love, and, most importantly, helping you look more like Jesus.

It's easy to live cautiously, building walls to protect ourselves from pain or disappointment. We convince ourselves that phrases like "I'm just being careful" or "I'm playing it safe" are signs of wisdom, but often they're just shields we use to avoid risk and stay in our comfort zones. In the process, we miss out on the opportunities, relationships, and experiences that God has waiting for us.

God calls us to a different way of living—a life rooted in trust. King David models this in Psalm 56:4 when, even surrounded by enemies, he declares, "In God, whose word I praise—in God I trust and am not afraid." David didn't ignore his fear; he chose to trust God's promises over his circumstances. His faith shows us that trust isn't about avoiding challenges—it's about facing them with confidence in God's power and love.

Trusting God doesn't eliminate uncertainty, but it does change how we face it. Instead of letting fear control us, trust allows us to step forward, knowing we are not alone. When we lean into God's faithfulness, we embrace His greater purpose, even when we can't see it clearly. His plans are bigger and better than we could ever imagine.

Throughout Scripture, God places a high value on justice. Proverbs 21:3 tells us that living justly matters more to Him than religious rituals. His commands are simple but profound: treat others fairly and advocate for those who are hurting or forgotten. When we act with kindness and compassion, we reflect God's love in a broken world.

Fighting for justice isn't about seeking vengeance—it's about lifting up those who are suffering. Judgment belongs to God; our role is to care for the wounded and extend His love to the vulnerable. This work requires humility, courage, and a commitment to put God's grace into action.

Today, take a step toward justice. Let your actions reflect God's heart and His call to love, knowing that every step you take toward justice makes His kingdom more visible in the world.

From the very beginning, humanity's desire for control has been a struggle. In Genesis 3, Adam and Eve were tempted by the idea of becoming like God, knowing good and evil, and that same longing for autonomy still drives us today. We want to steer our lives, call the shots, and ensure our happiness on our own terms.

But the truth is we weren't designed to bear the burden of ultimate control. When we cling too tightly to it, we often end up isolated, bitter, and exhausted. Our relationships suffer, and we lose the joy that comes from truly connecting with others. Trying to be in charge of everything leaves us disconnected and weighed down.

The antidote? Trust. Trusting God means releasing the need to control every outcome, believing that He is working for our good. Trusting others means stepping into vulnerability and leaning on the people God has placed around us. It's not easy, but it's the path to genuine peace and freedom.

Today take one step toward humility and submission. Ask God to show you where you're holding on too tightly and what it would look like to let go. Trust Him with that area and lean into the support of someone around you. Freedom and connection start with surrender.

Prayer is simply a conversation with God, yet many of us hesitate, worrying about finding the “right” words. But prayer isn’t about perfection—it’s about connection. The most powerful prayers come from the heart, spoken in our own natural words. God isn’t looking for eloquence; He’s listening for sincerity.

Think of prayer as talking to a loving father. Start with gratitude—thanking Him for anything good in your life—and then ask Him to meet specific needs. Be real, be honest, and trust that He hears you. You don’t need all the answers or polished words; God desires your authenticity.

Sometimes we don’t even know what to pray. In those moments, the Holy Spirit steps in, interceding for us and communicating our deepest needs to God (Romans 8:26). This is a beautiful reminder that prayer is less about what we say and more about opening our hearts to God’s presence.

Today, let go of any fear about prayer. Speak to God as you would a trusted friend, and let your words flow naturally. The more you pray, the more you’ll experience the comfort, strength, and deep relationship that comes from inviting God into your life.

NEXT STEPS

The GO Trip journey and daily on-the-ground rhythms allowed you to see how those practices can be incorporated into your life far beyond this trip. Keep doing them!

There are some other quick wheels to put in motion.

→ DURING TRAVEL HOME

→ FINAL GROUP MEETING

Your leader will schedule a time to get back together within a month or so of returning from your trip. This meeting will be a chance to celebrate your time together.

→ CONTINUE COMMUNITY BUILDING

Before you head home, take a moment to come up with a plan to stay in touch with your new teammates. Use this space to collect contact information: phone number, email address, social or email handles however you like to stay in touch. GO Trips can be life-changing experiences, and it's important to stay connected to the people who shared that journey with you.

The trip may be wrapping up, but the adventure isn't over. When you get home, you'll share your experience with friends, family, and coworkers. Whether it's a quick two-minute recap or a deep dive, think about what you want them to take away.

01 - Community

Today's daily challenge is to reach out to someone traveling with you that you haven't connected with yet. Take the initiative to initiate a conversation, extend an invitation, or simply check in to see how they're doing. Show genuine interest and actively listen to their thoughts and experiences.

Meeting someone new is an opportunity to connect with someone you haven't encountered before. Building connections with new people can broaden your perspectives and create opportunities for meaningful relationships to develop.

02 - Cultural Understanding

Today's daily challenge is to ask someone you're serving to share their favorite thing about their home or community. Language barrier? Try Google Translate or ask the local partner for help. We're called to reflect God's love and grace to people in communities different from our own.

Sometimes cultural differences may be difficult for us to understand. It's easy to judge. Remember that everyone was brought up with different norms and beliefs. Take time to learn about the culture of those you serve, listen with an open heart, and let God show you the beauty of His creation through their lives. As you do, you'll not only grow spiritually but also reflect His love in powerful ways. If you feel yourself beginning to judge, resist and just love like Jesus. Be an example of Christ's grace and love.

03 - Unity

Today's daily challenge is to connect with someone on this trip or someone you're serving who's different from you. Engage in conversation, offer encouragement, or collaborate on something meaningful. Unity starts with one small step.

Our default mindset tends to be focused on ourselves, but fostering a "team" mindset requires intentional effort and planning. Even the most humble people occasionally need to shift their focus away from self and towards the collective goals and well-being of the team.

04 - Suffering Well

Today's challenge is to find one way to extend grace and forgiveness toward the person or situation that has caused you suffering. Take a moment to reflect on how you can offer forgiveness and choose to do so. Be intentional in your actions and demonstrate grace towards those who have hurt you.

You may face hardships or witness the suffering of others today. Will you respond

with bitterness and blame, following societal norms? Or will you choose the path of Jesus, responding with grace and forgiveness?

05 - Trust

Your daily challenge is to have trust in God's plan for you, even if things aren't going as you would like. Embrace everything that comes your way, including delays, draining conversations, or uncomfortable tasks, with the belief that something good will come from it. Approach each situation with a joyful mindset, expecting that it will turn out to be great and that you will be glad you experienced it, even if it initially seems daunting.

Trust is the foundation of relationships and personal growth. It brings security, peace, and deeper connections. Trusting in God's plan provides hope, resilience, and a sense of purpose. It allows us to navigate life's challenges with confidence, knowing we are not alone.

06 - Justice

Today your daily challenge is to rely on your team. At some point you might come across something that triggers your sense of justice and makes you feel frustrated and angry. When that happens, share it with a team member and ask them to pray for you. Specifically, ask them to pray that God will guide you in showing grace and forgiveness to the person who is causing the injustice.

It's really easy to get frustrated, angry or overwhelmed at the injustice and oppression you see around you. The trouble is that it too often leaves us stuck in anger and despair. How can we process together to settle our hearts and be fruitful in response?

07 - Humility/Submission

Your daily challenge is to intentionally lean into trust in a moment when someone makes a comment or decision you disagree with. Trust that God wants to do something very specific in you as you submit to that decision. In other words, yield to God.

Chances are sometime today somebody is going to do or say something you do not agree with. It could be how to handle a project, a conversation you are in or it could be something as simple as them reminding you to Be G.U.M.B.Y. This is the moment that we have to stop ourselves and think through how trust can lead us through.

08 - Spiritual Gifts

Today's challenge is to uplift and encourage someone on your team in a meaningful way. Avoid the temptation of a generic "good job" and instead, highlight something specific. Recognize a challenge they have overcome, acknowledge their contribution to a difficult task, or appreciate their leadership (remember, leaders

are part of the team too). Take this opportunity to publicly praise them for their efforts.

God empowers us with diverse gifts, some requiring practice to understand. Yet one ability he equips us all with is the power to encourage one another. Let's embrace this gift and bring hope and inspiration to those around us.

09 - Poverty

Your daily challenge today is to consider the true definition of poverty. If we look at the word poverty as simply meaning having an "insufficient amount" of something, does it change in your mind who might be impoverished? Take time to witness rich areas of abundance in the hearts of the people you serve today.

Poverty is a tricky one—it can be easy to blanket statement poverty as a lack of financial resources. What happens when we shift our mind set to poverty being anything we are lacking as a group or culture? You might find a community commonly looked down upon for lacking financial resources is rich in joy, love and compassion for others.

10 - Leadership

Today, intentionally use your influence to make a positive impact. Find a moment to guide someone with positivity. It may be teaching a skill and allowing them to try on their own. It could be offering positive encouragement or redirection in a task or conversation. Humble yourself to lead another person.

Leadership is not defined by titles or positions, but by the impact we have on others. Regardless of our background, we all have the power to influence someone every day. It is our choice how we use that influence and the impact we make on others.

11 - Service

Today's challenge is to perform an act of service for someone (bonus if it is someone you don't know well). It could be as simple as helping them carry their bag, getting them food, or cleaning the mud off their shoes. You will be amazed by the sense of peace and connection that arises when you serve others in this way.

Serving others can be challenging. It may feel uncomfortable and even awkward at times. However, there is nothing more rewarding for our relationships and spiritual well-being than extending acts of service to others.

12 - Prayer

Today your challenge is to demystify praying out loud for someone else by doing just that. It doesn't have to be deep or elaborate. It doesn't have to have the right bible verse or be "churchy."z In fact, simply listening and talking is key.

Many of us have not prayed out loud before, even those getting more mature in their faith. It's common to feel the pressure of the right words to say. The secret is that you don't have to have them, and actually the best prayers are not planned. All

you have to do is listen to what the person is needing the most and ask God for it in your own natural words, as you would ask a loving father.

A common guide of how to help you get started is to begin with gratitude towards God, ask Him to step in to what is needed and then yield to the guidance given. You may find that the Holy Spirit provides you with words you did not have yourself.

13 - Freedom

Take a moment for today's challenge and reflect on something you desire to be free from. It could be a fear, worry, temptation, or any other burden that weighs on your heart. Whatever comes to mind, find a teammate and courageously share it with them, even if it feels uncomfortable and awkward. Remember, freedom awaits on the other side.

Through Jesus' sacrifice, we are offered more than just forgiveness for our past mistakes. His sacrifice grants us true freedom, releasing us from the grip of sin, fear, doubt, worry, and all other things that burden us. Embrace this freedom and trust in the power of Jesus' love and grace to transform your life.

14 - Adventure

Today, your task is to take a moment and think about what you believe will be the most difficult part of the day. Once you have identified it, challenge yourself to spend the next two minutes intentionally shifting your mindset to be excited about it. Instead of focusing on the struggles to overcome, direct your thoughts towards the positive outcome you desire.

When we think about our upcoming day, it's inevitable that we will encounter some difficulties. Our instinct is to feel annoyed by the discomfort and try to avoid it. However, this is the moment when we are called to "GO" out of our comfort zones, be unassuming, and yield to what God has in store for us.

15 - Sacrifice

Today's challenge will ask you to sacrifice for someone else but here's the twist. We want you to sacrifice for someone back home. Take a moment today to understand what it feels like to sacrifice your time, trip money, comfort and more to help those you are serving on this trip. What feelings come with helping others before yourself? Think about how you can continue that amazing sacrifice when you get back home.

Sacrifice can take many forms. On this trip you have sacrificed a lot to take a trip journey that is out of your comfort zone and serve others. The rewards of that sacrifice are eternal. Here's a secret: you can continue that amazing sacrifice in your own town and city when you return home by serving at a local non-profit. That is how you share your heart.
